


The "Service" in Service-Learning

Why service-learning meets the needs of learners:

- Service involves collaboration
- Service helps us construct our experience by doing
- Service provides an authentic context
- Service can help us discover intrinsic motivation
- Service is self-directed and geared to the individual

- DO make good partnerships; you can have students choose their own, but learning is better if there is a clear understanding between BC and the agency
- DO consider offering different levels of service



Lessons Learned: What I would have done differently

- Create a way for students to connect with each other (in class or on Canvas?) about the service-learning project.
- Make sure students have a communication plan and action plan with their agencies.
- Do a "Level 1" project together as a class before having students decide on their own individual projects and level of commitment.




