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I'm looking forward to being your instructor in this course. This is my 7th year teaching on-line, but I've taught full-time at BC for many years, 22 to be exact! I teach a variety of courses: creative writing, composition, literature, interdisciplinary studies. I also teach the non-fiction creative writing course, and serve as the instructor for our online literary magazine, *Belletrist*. My favorite literature courses to teach are Gothic and Horror Fiction and Women's Literature, and I'm excited that the Gothic and Horror Fiction will be offered online this coming Winter 2013. I teach all ranges of composition, from developmental to second year composition. I enjoy teaching as much as I did when I first started; watching students grow in their skills and understanding continues to be greatly rewarding to me.

What do I like to do outside of teaching? My hobby (or really passion) is dog training and showing. That's why the only pictures I have here are with my dogs. I show my springer spaniels in all kinds of events: obedience trials, hunting trials, agility (which you might have seen on TV) and conformation shows (like Westminster that airs on TV in February). I'm also a practicing, published writer, with two quarterly columns appearing in nationally published magazines and newsletters. I started a short fiction piece over the summer and write poetry. So I know what it's like to try to invent new topics, draft ideas and face deadlines. I'm

excited about working with you in this class.
